FCO NEWS

Leadbetter Point, WA to Cape Falcon, OR

June 25 through the earlier of September 30 or 49,860 fin-clipped coho subarea quota, with a 16,600 Chinook subarea guideline. Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon, all coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. Two salmon per day, but no more than one Chinook. Possession of salmon onboard a vessel is prohibited in the area prior to June 25 when the subarea is closed to salmon retention.

Notes: Closed within the Columbia Control Zone.

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain

All Salmon Except Coho Season—Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain:

March 15 - June 6. Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon except coho, two salmon per day.

Mark-Selective Coho (fin-clipped) Season - Cape Falcon to OR/CA border:

June 7 through the earlier of August 24 or 44,000 fin-clipped coho quota. Two salmon per day. When Chinook retention is allowed, no more than one Chinook. All retained coho must have a healed adipose fin-clip.

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain:

June 7 - July 15, Chinook retention allowed (no more than one daily)

July 16 - August 24 (or quota), no Chinook retention

Non-Mark Selective Coho Season (all salmon) - Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain

Open September 1 through the earlier of September 30 or 30,000 non-mark-selective coho quota. Open days may be modified in-season. Open seven days per week. All salmon, two salmon per day, but no more than one Chinook.

All Salmon Except Coho Season—Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain:

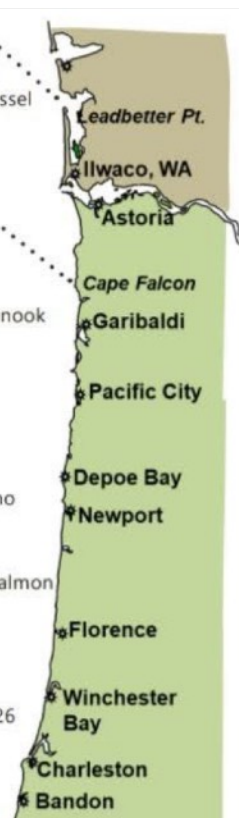
The earlier of October 1 or the end of the Non-Mark Selective season through October 31. Open for all salmon except coho, one salmon per day. Open only shoreward of the 40-fathom regulatory line.

Notes:

- Within the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Conservation Area salmon angling is restricted to trolling on all depth halibut days.
- Chinook Season (all salmon except coho) from Cape Falcon to OR/CA border will reopen March 15, 2026 unless modified by in-season action in March 2026.

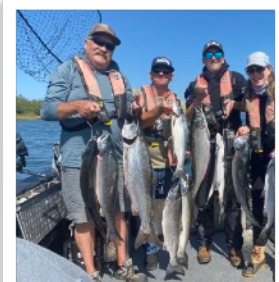
Humbug Mountain to OR/CA Border

Oregon Announces Ocean Salmon Seasons - Plan now!

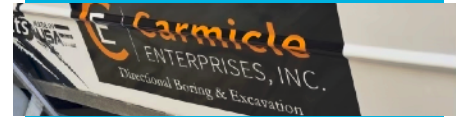

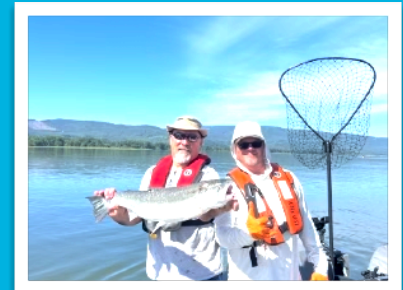
Spring Chinook

There's nothing better than tasting that first Chinook of the year. The buttery flavor is like no other Chinook salmon. The Willamette river prediction is for over 51,000 fish and that's a nice increase from last year. Fish are finally starting to show. We enjoy this Fishery well into June most years.



Summer Steelhead on the Columbia it's a blast!

With our super busy lives, if you don't plan your summer, somebody's gonna plan it for you. We had a blast last year catching these amazing fish. Why not look ahead and book a day or two during the large tide exchanges that make this Fishery really cook! Bring your sunscreen! Late May and June on the lower Columbia between Saint Helens and Astoria.



White and Green Sturgeon

We pursue Sturgeon in the lower 90 miles of the Columbia River and Willamette River. This fishery is mainly catch and release. I don't think I've ever experienced someone who's not completely impressed after they catch their first one. Most of the fish we catch now are EVEN LARGER than the Green Sturgeon pictured! Try a combo trip with spring, Chinook and Sturgeon in the same day during May and June. July is prime time for catch and release down river near Astoria on the Columbia River.

I'm happy to host these local trips in July. We mainly fish the Multnomah channel on the Willamette. This is a great trip to catch some different warm water species as well. It's usually a hit with kids as the weather is nice and the action is consistent.

Pacific and Lower Columbia Salmon

We enjoyed some really great fishing for Coho and Chinook in the Pacific near the mouth of the Columbia and up river in 2024. In 2025 look for some of the best days to book to be in the last two weeks of July for the ocean and then the small tides on the Buoy 10 opener around August 1. Of course, the traditional mid and late August should produce around Astoria that's a given and is very popular. After Labor Day will certainly be back up river closer to Portland to finish up the fall season with some more incredible catching. July, August and September are my busiest and most productive months.
